### **Reginald Davis Johnson** DEDICATED TO THE PRINCIPLES OF SOUND COMPOSITION AND PROPORTION **BY ROSE THOMAS**

EGINALD Davis Johnson (1882–1952), an architect whose practice was based in Los Angeles, is primarily known for his lavish residential projects-many in the Santa Barbara area. Among these is the house sitting within the gardens of Lotusland. His other local projects include the world-renowned Biltmore Hotel, Cate School and his most notable public building, Santa Barbara's downtown post office.

Born in New York, the family lived for a time in Detroit and later moved to California. As a teen, Johnson spent many carefree summers in Santa Barbara and Montecito. After receiving a degree from Williams College, he completed his architectural degree at Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

From the beginning, Johnson paid close attention to detail, the day-to-day needs of his client and the relationship of the building to its environment. Such traits would characterize his work throughout his career.

Impressed with the buildings designed by Bertram Goodhue for the 1915 Pan American Exposition in San Diego with their combined Spanish, Italian and Mediterranean influences, Johnson developed his own interpretation of this style.

Mira Flores, Johnson's earliest and most acclaimed example of the Mediterranean style, was a remodeling of the former Santa Barbara Country Club building into a stately residence. This commission garnered Johnson the 1920 Gold Medal from the National American Institute of Architects as the most outstanding example of residential architecture nationwide—the first time Continued on page 2

this award had ever been presented to a West Coast architect.

In 1918, Erastmus Palmer Gavit, a capitalist from Albany, New York, purchased the Santa Barbara property known as Tanglewood and hired Johnson to design a home that the family named Cuesta Linda, which would eventually be purchased by Ganna Walska. Because of WWI, the house was not completed and the family did not move in until 1920.

Shortly before he died, Reginald Johnson destroyed his archive. Unless he gave the plans and drawings to the client, the majority of his records no longer exist. Various original plans for Cuesta Linda by Johnson, and numerous alterations and additions to the residence/property by George Washington Smith, are in the archives at Lotusland. Numerous forgotten drawings, elevations and plans by Johnson for Cuesta Linda were recently found among Smith's plans for the house in UCSB's Architectural Design Collection.

This rediscovered material shows that in March 1921, Johnson designed an expansion of the dining room and a deck above. off of Mr. Gavit's secondfloor study. However, a few months later, George Washington Smith elaborated on Johnson's design, altering and replacing certain elements of the room. In place of Johnson's two French doors, Smith installed three of his signature arched French doors, interspaced between four simple interior columns. Smith also replaced Johnson's beam and plaster ceiling with the coffered ceiling we see today. The original fireplace was removed and a new one was centered along the same wall of the newly expanded room. The deep-set window on Johnson's revised plan was executed, but Smith added cast concrete window seats with supporting balustrades underneath and placed tile over what appears in Johnson's plans to have been a fine wood parquet floor.

Similarly to Mira Flores, Johnson framed the residence's entryway with decorative cast stonework. His trademark wooden shutters and spindle-work were featured on the second floor windows and balconies. It is likely that Ambassador Clarke, the owner prior to Madame Ganna Walska, had the

stonework removed as well as making other alterations to the house during his and his wife's short occupancy

A likely explanation for the family's decision to switch architects could be

that Johnson—in his tenth year of a well-respected practice—was busy with a multitude of projects in Pasadena and Los Angeles, as well as Montecito and Santa Barbara. Smith, in practice only for a few years and most likely eager for commissions, was also conveniently local. It is quite possible that Johnson may even have recommended Smith and given him license to use his plans. Whatever the case may be, after his work for the family in 1921, Smith became the go-to architect for all future Cuesta Linda projects, of which there were many.

Two other significant residential designs by Johnson in the Santa Barbara area include Rancho San Carlos, built for E.P. Gavit's daughter Ann and her husband Charles H. Jackson, Jr., and the beautifully restrained Bellosguardo, now widely known as the Clark Estate. All of these structures demonstrate hallmarks of Johnson's work: consideration for the past, love of beauty and dedication to the principles of sound composition and proportion.

Known for his gentle charm and said to be without class or race prejudice, Johnson was deeply affected by the sufferings of people during the depression and began an active campaign to find a solution for the obvious need to build decent urban housing.

Closing his lucrative private practice, Johnson devoted his energies and the last 15 years of his life to local, state and national housing organizations.

Reginald Johnson firmly believed in the role architecture plays in our daily lives and was responsive to social, cultural and environmental conditions.

By creating appealing places in which to live and work, he not only contributed to the profession of architecture, but enhanced the lives of his clients and community members as well.

# Director's Letter

S SUMMER ENDS, the soft light and long shadows of autumn transform Lotusland. The garden seems quieter, although no less vibrant with sensory delights and the bustle of gardeners and guests.

Ripening seed pods of the lotuses now only reminders of their spectacular pink blooms of summer-will soon collapse as the plants go dormant to rest in the mud. Meanwhile, our newly renovated insectary garden is abundant with blooms that support the pollinating and predatory fauna that are our organic gardening allies. The insectary garden is a lovely place to sit, relax to the cooing of doves and peeps of finches, and meditate on the lemon arbor and succulent-draped vase beyond. Other parts of the garden are just beginning their displays. In several weeks, the aloes will push the buds that become torch-like blossoms, making the garden come alive with hummingbirds all winter.

So the cycle goes: an endless revolution of seasons within a garden of living things—plants, wildlife and people—all growing, ever changing and transforming. Only one thing never changes, and that is the continuous cultivation required to nurture all the living beings that benefit from Lotusland's stewardship. This constant need is exacerbated by our Conditional Use Permit that restricts the number of visitors, students and events we may host, and days we may operate, which then restricts Lotusland's ability to generate revenue. Consequently, Lotusland is very dependent upon the generosity of members and donors to raise two-thirds of the annual budget each and every year.

Most people are under the impression that Ganna Walska left adequate funding to sustain the garden forever, yet this has never been the case. Building Lotusland's endowment is a critical priority, and there are so many ways donors can give—either with a bequest or outright gift, either to the endowment fund or completely restricted to the care of a garden of their choice.

Now, it is easier than ever to support Lotusland in perpetuity. We are thrilled that Anne Dewey has decided to take on a new role as Lotusland's Director of Planned Giving, and you

### Anne Dewey CHANCE OF A LIFETIME

N 1990, ANNE DEWEY joined a fledgling organization with the difficult mission to open Ganna Walska Lotusland to the public. Fastforward more than 26 years—through the efforts of Anne and her co-workers, Lotusland has blossomed into one of the "10 Best Gardens in the World."\* This is a testament to Anne's life work and the passion that helped create phenomenal results that are recognized on a global scale.

After Ganna Walska's death, it took nine years and 63 public hearings before the first guests were allowed in the garden. Anne Dewey was a member of this very small team doing literally everything to open Lotusland and raise the necessary funds to keep it open. Celebrating the news that public tours were approved, Anne says they toasted, "Oh my gosh, we're open!" Which was followed by a more sobering thought, "Uh-oh, we're open." The entire visitor services infrastructure had to be built, from reservations through docent training and tours.

Steven Timbrook, Lotusland's first Executive Director, said, "Selecting Anne Dewey was one of the luckiest decisions I ever made." He describes her as an innovator who was instrumental in creating the membership program, launching *The Lotus Society* and building the hugely successful *Lotusland Celebrates* gala. Everyone involved with Lotusland believed it was important to do something meaningful for the community, and Anne was on the team that built

Lotusland's acclaimed Fourth Grade Outreach program. Her roles have been diverse, including writing the newsletter, managing human resources, grant writing, docent training, giving tours, working in the kiosk, answering phones and, in 2000, Anne assumed the role of Director of Development. Anne's impact is evident in just about every aspect of Lotusland. When asked about working with Anne, Kisa Heyer, Lifetime Honory Trustee, says, "Anne has truly been one of the greatest treasures of the garden. Her love for Lotusland and her dedication to it are unsurpassed."

Anne regards working with so many dedicated people as a rare privilege,

from the "volunteers who choose to come here to learn to share and to give, to the trustees and coworkers who are inspiring, fun and have become wonderful lifelong friends, and the tens of thousands of guests in the garden." As a people person, she sees the garden as a feast of wonderful personalities. In her more than two-and-a-half decades. Anne is a keeper of the lore that includes stories as rich as the gardens themselves. These include the famous (Cher, Brad Pitt, Mick Jagger, John Cleese, Barbara Streisand), the touching (past gardeners returning for one final look), the sometimes crazy (elephants, giraffes, unicorns, Jimi Hendrix impersonators) and even the ghost stories.

Arthur Gaudi, a founding trustee, says that Anne "was present at the creation," and her efforts and creativity were so vital that Lotusland is forever "indebted to her." Arthur worked closely with Anne to develop *The Lotus Society*, which Anne believes is "the future of the garden." In her new role as Director of Planned Giving, she will focus on these gifts that help to guarantee Lotusland's longterm financial stability. ### Japanese Garden Renovation CAMPAIGN UPDATE: WE ARE HALF-WAY TO OUR GOAL!

OTUSLAND'S JAPANESE GARDEN renovation plan includes two primary objectives: make the garden accessible for all visitors; and create a healthy, clean and clear pond ecosystem.

The Japanese garden is situated in a deep earthen bowl dug by the estate's first owner, Ralph Kinton Stevens, to mine the local clay. This created a big hole, which he then flooded for an irrigation pond. Later, the Gavit family lowered the pond's water and built narrow winding paths for strolling around it. Madame Walska retained this path system when she created her Japanese garden. As with many historic public gardens that originated as private estates, Lotusland's Japanese garden is not wheelchair accessible, and we

plan to modify the paths to meet accessibility standards of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The pond's original clay lining still remains; as a result, the pond water is always cloudy with sediment, and algae frequently bloom on the pond surface. Unfortunately, crayfish and exotic turtles introduced into the pond have damaged the lotuses and completely decimated the water lilies. We will line the pond with an impermeable material with built-in beds for the aquatic plants and safe havens for the Koi fish, and we will add a bio-filtration system to maintain clear water.

Achieving these two objectives is very complicated and expensive; estimated construction costs are \$4 million. Generous donors have contributed just over \$2 million so far, getting us halfway to our goal. We will continue to ask donors for support to raise the remainder of the funds so that we can break ground in early 2017.

LANNING IS UNDERWAY for another fabulous plant auction and sale on Saturday, October 8. Many of the plants to hit the auction list are propagations from Lotusland's collections, and, as to be expected, there are some interesting and rare specimens. Signature begonias from the collection include *B. gehrtii*, which has extremely crumpled leaves, and the very frilly *B.* 'Madame Queen,' among others. From the giant leaves of *Xanthosoma* (a relative of the taro plant) to the diminutive ones of a succulent *Peperomia kimnachii*, there is a wide variety of plant forms to choose from. Subtropical aroids like *Anthurium watermaliense* and desert-loving aloes such as *Aloe confusa*, as well as cactuses and palms, round out the list. Look for updates on our website.

Guests are treated to specialty cocktails, wine, beer and sumptuous hors d'oeuvres for the ultimate plant party. The live auction once again features the talents of auctioneer Jeff Chemnick, and for the impulse buyers, an expanded selection of fine plants will be available to "buy now" at the Garden Shop.

NE OF THE other benefits of the donations from our generous colleagues to *Exceptional Plants* is in adding more interesting, and sometimes rare, plant species to the garden.

This year we are able to add a number of bromeliads to the collection. For example, a few rare or uncommon species of Puya have been donated. Puya assurgens is an uncommon species from Jujuy, Argentina. P. castellanosii is also from Argentina and considered endangered in its native range in the Salta region. One of the largest bromeliads in the world is P. raimondii, which is native to arid slopes of the Andes Mountains. It grows a large trunk, up to 10 feet tall, but it is the stunning flower stalk that makes it a striking specimen when it reaches maturity. This immense spike of tiny flowers can tower up to 30 feet in the wild. We can only hope for a garden-grown specimen that will be nearly as amazing. These were donated by Ernie Pfadenhauer, a true plant enthusiast and currently Co-President of the Santa Barbara County Horticultural

Society, one of the oldest such organizations in the country.

Another group of interesting plants donated last year included a large specimen of a variegated *Monstera deliciosa* that now graces the tropical garden and, in the bromeliad garden, some colorful bromeliads named for a well-known hybridizer—*Aechmea blanchettiana* 'Wally Berg'—donated by Ron Caird, owner of Por la Mar Nursery in Santa Barbara, who actually worked at Lotusland

Other plants that were also featured in past auctions included *Begonia* 'Cachuma,' a hybrid by the famed Santa Barbara nurseryman Rudy Ziesenhenne, which was donated by Diane Dunhill. *Euphorbia pseudocactus* soon joins the other euphorbias, and *Neoregelia* 'Sheba,' a stunning green and cream variegated bromeliad with a bright red center, both courtesy of Ron Caird, now grows in the bromeliad garden. —*Virginia Hayes*

# Horticultural Happenings

### LAUREN BARKLEY: SUMMER INTERN 2016

THE ANTICIPATION of spending all summer at Lotusland was all that was on my mind in early June of 2016. I arrived late one afternoon and Tyler Diehl, the Director of Gardens and Facilities, was there to greet me with a warm smile. After getting settled in the adorable green cottage, I was off to explore the gardens. The incredible detail and horticultural architecture was unique and well-crafted—I was awestruck at the gardens and could not believe how lucky I was to spend my summer at Lotusland. The first few weeks I worked closely with Corey Welles, the Plant Health Care Coordinator. He taught me everything he could about compost piles, soil biology, compost tea, native pollinators and insectary plants. I helped him install the newest garden at Lotusland called the insectary garden, and I had the good fortune to work side by side with Eric Nagelmann, the designer of the garden.

All of the talented gardeners at Lotusland were great teachers. I learned precision pruning techniques in the Japanese garden, how to trap gophers and moles, how to make and apply compost tea and what it does to help the plant ecosystem. I learned how to prune roses to ensure a beautiful second bloom, to work safely around cactus and what it means to accession a garden. I worked with a team of great people, whether that meant removing a 100-year-old agave or choreographing a cooking routine at lunchtime. Every person I met has taught me something

### SOMETHING'S MISSING

THE OAK TREE that was planted four years ago to replace the majestic Donkey Tail Oak, *Quercus agrifolia*, has died after we first noticed a yellowing of its leaves in the middle of August.

The tree was removed and root samples sent to the State Agricultural Commissioner for analysis. Lotusland's horticulture and PHC staff examined the roots and root flare to determine the cause. No *Armillaria* was found, and the roots looked like they had been dead for some time. The tree may have died months prior and was living on stored energy. We had high hopes for this tree; it had done well for the four years after being transplanted.
